Health and Safety Policy Statement

- Not interfere with, misuse, or wilfully damage anything provided in the interest of health and safety.
- Report all accidents or near misses, however minor, to their Site Supervisor or Line.
 Manager as soon as possible.
- Cooperate with any investigation into health and safety incidents.

To ensure this policy remains effective, the Company will:

- Review it annually or following significant changes in the business.
- Communicate any changes to all employees.
- Maintain clear procedures for communication and consultation across all levels of staff regarding health, safety, and welfare.

Contractors

All contractors must comply with applicable health and safety laws and regulations. Contractors are responsible for their own employees and for ensuring all work is performed safely and in accordance with agreed procedures.

Consultation, Participation and Training

The Managing Director is committed to employee involvement in maintaining health and safety standards. A staff Health and Safety Representative is appointed and invited to health and safety meetings. Training is provided during induction and on-site, and refresher training is conducted when needed. Staff are encouraged to raise any health and safety concerns at any time.

The Company is committed to the continuous improvement of its health and safety management systems and to the prevention of accidents within the workplace and wider environment.
